Hello and welcome back. We hope you had a fantastic Easter and are ready for the last term in Year 4





This newsletter will provide you with an overview of what your child will be doing this term in Year 4.



English



Our English will link to our topic work about Vikings and Anglo-Saxons. We will be writing our own stories based on the Anglo-Saxon story of Beowulf. We will also be looking at Viking god myths.



Maths

In Maths we will focus on rounding to the nearest 10/100, negative numbers, equivalent fractions and converting measures. The children will be focusing on applying their knowledge to reasoning tasks.






Topic



This term our history based topic is Vikings and Anglo-Saxons. We will be learning about Anglo-Saxon settlements, Viking invasion and life in the United Kingdom up to 1066. In science we will be looking at sound and electricity by investigating volume and pitch, making electrical circuits and drawing circuit diagrams.

In PE the children will be learning about multi-skills which involves developing balance, coordination and agility. 



Homework
