<p>Read at least 3 times a week. Read at home or online. Go to www.oxfordowl.co.uk or read along to books on https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/. We will add reading materials to Tapestry on Friday if you would like to use those too.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Listen to Mr Faulder read The Little Raindrop by Joanna Gray story from Monday Talk about the journey of the raindrop with a grown up.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Create a representation of the water cycle. Show us what happens in the water cycle. Use the journey of The Little Raindrop or listen to The Water Cycle Song online (by Hopscotch online) to help your understanding. You can make a poster, drawing, painting, video or presentation to show how the water cycle works.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Play Number line games. You can use the number line we sent home to count in 1s and 2s up to and back from 20. Can you roll a dice and find the number on the number line? Or roll two numbers, add them together and find the total. You can play number games online too.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	
<p>Make an instrument that sounds like rainfall. Search "How to make a rain stick" if you would like some ideas.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Use dance to represent the water cycle. How can you move like raindrops, a river, the sea or evaporation with movement to music? You could use the Water Cycle Song by Have Fun Teaching, or bust some dance moves with Blazer Fresh to the Water Cycle dance on Go Noodle (older siblings make like this too!)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Number bonds to 10, 5 or 20 Do you know which numbers add together to make a total of 10? How many ways can you make 10 by adding two numbers together? Use practical objects to solve this problem or the Numberframes software: https://www.mathlearningcenter.org/resources/apps/number-frames. You could use the sheets attached to make number bonds to 5, 10, or 20, or record it in your book.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Observe the weather over the 2 weeks and make a daily weather chart. Make a chart that you can change each day, or record the weather on a chart and include up to as many days of weather as you can record it for.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	
<p>Practise your number formation 0-9. Use the number formation sheets attached and record numbers independently too, making sure they start in the correct place. Can you recognise and write numbers greater than 10? Are the numbers written the right way around (e.g. 15, not 51?)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Write at least 3 sentences per week. Use your sound mat to help and try to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sound out each word (or spell tricky words) - Use fingers spaces between words - Use a full stop at the end of a sentence - Form letters correctly - Write on the line if you can Write about anything you like. You could use 'and' to extend a sentence.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Pick two or three colours from the rainbow to make a repeating pattern. Create the repeating pattern of colours using objects, a drawing or painting, just be careful to check that the pattern repeats correctly.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>	<p>Review Phase 3 sounds oo, oo, ar and or and review Phase 3 tricky words. Go to BBC Bitesize Phase 3 Phonics to help practise the sounds. Apply them by reading and writing words including the sounds, e.g. car, start, fork, moon, spoon, book, hood. Play tricky word bingo, do a word hunt or a word search to practise the tricky words.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>
