# Animals, including Humans

### Mammals:

- Warm- blooded
- Most have hair
- They give birth to live young and produce milk to feed them
- Humans are mammals also, monkeys, lions, bears, dogs, cats and cows



### Reptiles:

- Cold-blooded
- They lay eggs/ have scales
- They breathe through lungs
- Examples: lizards, crocodiles and snakes



### Insects:

- Have six legs
- Cold-blooded
- Lay many eggs
- Are made up of a head, thorax and abdomen with a pair of antennae
- Have one or two pairs of wings



### Fish:

- Cold-blooded and live in water
- They breathe through their gills
- Have fins/scales
- Examples: sharks, salmon and rays



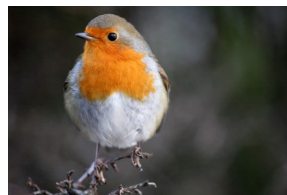
### Amphibians:

- Cold-blooded which can live in water and on land
- Examples: frogs, toads and salamander



### Birds:

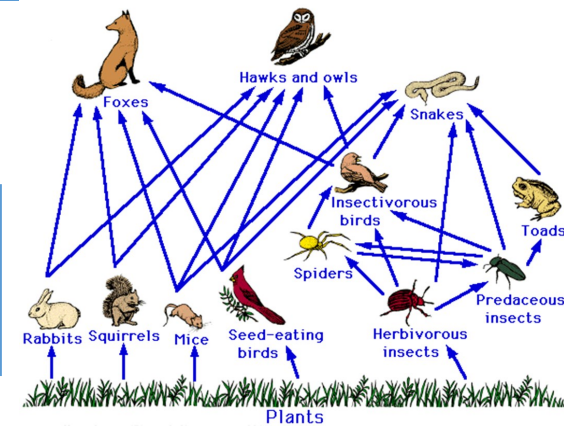
- Animals with feathers, a beak or bill
- They have two wings and two legs
- Warm-blooded
- Lay eggs



## Key vocabulary

Vertebrates	Have a backbone inside their body.
Invertebrate	They don't have a backbone they either have a soft body or a hard outer casing covering their body.
Carnivore	Meaning a meat eater. Example- crocodile, lion, shark
Herbivore	Primary food source is plant-based. Example- elephants, deer's, rabbits
Omnivore	Can eat and survive on both plant and meat matter. Example- badgers, lizards, brown bears
Predator	An animal that naturally preys on others.
Prey	An animal taken by a predator for food,
Producer	Generate food for themselves, they do this by using light energy from the sun, carbon dioxide and water.
Consumer	They cannot make their own food so they need to consume (eat) plants and/or animals.

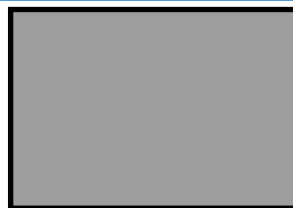
