Welcome back!

We hope you have all had a wonderful summer. Welcome back to our Year 2s and we would like to give a warm welcome to our Year 1s. We are very excited about the year ahead. Here is an outline of what your child will be learning during their first half term. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask. We want to make sure that the transition into their new year groups is a smooth and happy one for everyone.

We would like to welcome Mrs Ahearne and Mrs Mosley who will be working as a job share with Mrs Langdown, to our KS1 team.

During this term, we will be investigating the question 'What is interesting about Burton Joyce?' We will be introducing this topic by looking at where Burton Joyce is in the world. The local study will look specifically at the railway and the river. We will then be distinguishing between the human and physical features. This topic will involve a walk around the village in October and we are looking for volunteers to help, please speak to your child's class teacher if you are able to join us.

English –During the first 2 weeks we will focus on fictional stories. The children will be retelling and rewriting stories, as well as learning some nursery rhymes. Later in the term, they will begin to explore non-fiction text on rivers.

Maths – Year 1 will be looking at place value within 10, working on ordering numbers, recognising numbers as words and finding one more and one less. Year 2 will be working with numbers to 100, understanding the place value of tens and ones through pairing, ordering and partitioning.

Science - Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

Computing – We will begin the term by refreshing our E-safety knowledge and then work with the iPad to develop our photography skills by learning how to frame a shot, crop images and simple editing techniques.

Art – We will be studying the work of John Constable and looking at how he developed his landscape paintings. We will then be developing our own sketching skills and applying a range of techniques to create our own landscape sketches and a collage of Burton Joyce.

PSHE – Being me in the World. We are looking at our hopes and fears, rights and responsibilities, and rewards and consequences.

P.E. –We will be focusing on developing hand eye coordination to send an object with increasing confidence with hand or bat. We will apply this to games using basic serving skills.

Music – We will be exploring and composing different types of music for marching. We will develop singing rhythmically to a variety of different songs throughout the term.

RE. Jesus' friends and followers. Pupils will have opportunities to develop their skills by exploring, in a variety of ways, friendship as well as helping, respecting and valuing others. Pupils will investigate relationships, exploring such aspects as trustworthiness, caring, discrimination and being friendly.

Homework – Children will bring home a copy of the homework for this half term on Friday 8th September, a copy will also be posted on TEAMS. (Login in details for this can be found in the back of Reading Diaries.) Stars will be earned for each piece of work completed and children are challenged to collect at least 20 stars over the half term. Some tasks will be individual tasks (white boxes) and others are set as weekly tasks (in grey boxes). We ask that children keep their homework at home until the week beginning the 16th October. During this week the children will be given the opportunity to celebrate and share their work with the rest of the class.

Spellings are sent out weekly, to rehearse the phonics they are learning in school. We continue to advise daily reading, this is crucial in ensuring that the children develop the skills to apply phonics in their reading. Book band books will be sent home by Friday 8th September and book bag phonics books which match the children's phonic learning will follow once the children's phonics assessments have been completed. All of these books are determined by the results of different weekly and half termly assessments.
