Curriculum Design & Sequencing of Content

We teach children a knowledge rich curriculum that is ambitious and designed to build in knowledge content as children progress through school.

Geography topics are organised into a linear sequence building on children's prior knowledge. All year groups study a Geography topic each term (see topic overview). Topics are linked by relevant content to our school context.

Powerful knowledge is clearly identified on planning.

Digmaps/Odizzi

As a school, we have bought into two online geography resources that support with the planning and teaching of geography across the school. **Digimaps** offers teachers and children access to a range of interactive maps and geography resources. **Oddizzi** provides teachers with high-quality primary geography resources to support with planning. The children all have a log-in for Oddizzi which enables them to practice their knowledge through quizzes.

Geography at Burton Joyce Primary School

Geography forms an important part of our curriculum. We follow the National curriculum and embrace a broad-spectrum of stimulating topics. As a school, we aim to inspire curiosity and fascination about the UK and the wider world and wholly develop each pupils geographical skills, understanding and knowledge using a wide range of primary and secondary sources. Consequently our lessons are well planned, engaging and challenge all abilities, where children are encouraged to engage in meaningful discussions using appropriate vocabulary.

Retrieval Practice

Children take part in regular mini-quizzes and retrieval activities to strengthen memory.

Knowledge organisers are used regularly to support learning of new information; to revisit concepts and make connections.

Geographical Lens

Each Geography unit will incorporate all elements of our 'Geographical Lens':

- Space and Scale (locational)
- Physical features
- ♦ Human Features
- Change and Sustainability

Map Skills

Children use maps, atlases and globes to investigate and engage with the location they are studying using a 'zoom in, zoom out approach'.

<u>Fieldwork</u>

Fieldwork is an integral part of our geography curriculum; it enables formal learning to occur outside of the classroom and gives children the opportunity to 'see' and 'do' geography. It immerses children in the key content of their learning, to develop their knowledge and the added value to their classroom experiences.

We have built strong links with the Burton Joyce
History Society who have helped us with the
design of both our History and Geography
curriculum, as well as providing present day and
historical photographs and maps of the local
area, to support is in exploring how the local
area has changed over time.
