Our ambassadors have continued to encourage a positive approach to learning and life for all pupils and staff across the school. We have led an assembly at the start of Well Being Week to explain different ways in which we can look after ourselves and others better.

Part of a positive approach looked at activities away from screen time. We learnt about the RSPB bird watch, why this was important, and the value of being present and observing nature. Children were encouraged to report their findings.

The choir continues to be a positive focus in school and those in the current choir will be attending a Trust Wide concert. We have also been singing in preparation for our Easter services at the end of this Term.

and got these important messages across clearly.
