Positivity

Thank you for all our Positivity Ambassadors have done over the last year contributing to our PRIDE values. They have done an amazing job spreading positivity throughout the school by producing posters to display around the school and leading assemblies with confidence. They have also created a range of positive messages for each classroom to display in the next academic year. Thank you for all their hard work. Our ambassadors have continued to encourage a positive approach to learning and life for all pupils and staff across the school. We have led an assembly at the start of Well Being Week to explain different ways in which we can look after ourselves and others better.

Respect

Our Respect ambassadors helped create an online questionnaire for all pupils to have their voice to express their feelings about behaviour around school, how children treat each other, if they feel safe in school and if they feel happy at school. Our ambassadors supported our younger children in school to read and answer the questions. The ambassadors then met to analyse the results and picked out some key findings.

Class teachers discussed points raised with their class, such as making sure all children felt they could confide in an adult in school if they felt worried about something, addressing anything they felt unsure about such as why we do practice fire evacuations and shelter practices and thinking about what positive behaviour in our school looks like.



I ntegrity

This term the Integrity ambassadors have planned and delivered two internet safety assemblies.

The first one explained how to maintain good relationships with friends online and the importance of self-image on the internet.

The second assembly included our ambassadors explaining the importance of copyright and that if the children put their name and date on their work it belonged to them.



D etermination

Over the course of the last term, our Determination ambassadors have been working exceptionally hard motivating and driving the pupils from our school onto even greater levels of success. For example, on one of our Wellbeing Days, every pupil in our school was set the challenge of running a mile around our school grounds. Not only did our Determination Ambassadors set very high examples by completing the challenge themselves, they devoted time to producing motivational posters designed to inspire all of our children to help each other achieve the challenge. Whilst completing the challenge, our Determination Ambassadors were superb as they encouraged children who were struggling and ran at their pace so they had somebody to run alongside.

Our Equality Ambassadors worked together to present a whole school PRIDE assembly.

They passionately explained the meanings behind the colours in the PRIDE flag.

We discussed having confidence in your own identity and respecting and celebrating individuality and diversity, relating discussions to age-appropriate contexts such as fashion.

The ambassadors clearly did an amazing job as the audience were engaged throughout.
