This term the focus for the Respect ambassadors has been based around behaviour at lunchtimes. This includes being respectful to midday staff and cooks, being respectful to the hall environment and equipment. The Respect ambassadors undertook a behaviour learning walk where they made notes around the positive things they spotted but also any areas for improvement. The following day the ambassadors fed back to the whole school in an assembly. There were positives such as using manners and helping younger children. Some of the areas for improvement included ensuring tables are left respectfully and any food that may be dropped on the floor to be picked up.

The Integrity Ambassadors have been hard at work supporting online safety across the school. They helped review a school-wide online safety checklist, ensuring that classrooms have the right displays to remind everyone about staying safe online. As part of their role, they spoke with teachers about the learning that has taken place so far this year, gathering insights to support ongoing improvements. They also played a key role in the half-term assemblies, where they introduced class question and concern boxes.
