Our determination ambassadors undertook what was arguably their most ambitious project to date ... they took a leading role in helping to organise and carry out a Key Stage 2 wide careers event. From beginning to end, our ambassadors helped to make contact with parents, select parents from a wide and varied range of professions and greeted them on the day they arrived to talk to the children. To say it was a success would be a huge understatement: children now have a firmer idea as to what 6 different jobs entail.

Additionally, they were a tremendous support on sports day - encouraging all of our children to enjoy physical activities and to try their hardest.

This half term, our Equality Ambassadors delivered a powerful and engaging PRIDE assembly for the whole school. The assembly focused on celebrating diversity, inclusion, and the importance of standing up for equality. The Ambassadors began by explaining the meaning behind each colour of the PRIDE flag, helping everyone understand the deeper values the flag represents—like life, healing, sunlight, nature, harmony, and spirit. As part of the assembly, the children also highlighted inspirational figures from history who have worked to make positive change. These included Marsha P. Johnson, a key figure in the LGBTQ+ rights movement; Audre Lorde, a writer and activist who fought for racial and gender equality; and Dua Saleh, a modern-day artist and advocate for representation. Some of our students even had the courage to share personal stories, reminding us of all of the power of being true to ourselves and supporting one another.

Mrs Guerbaouy and Mrs Robinson took twenty of our wonderful children, including Integrity and Determination Ambassadors, House Captains, and Vice Captains, on an inspiring visit to the Air and Space Institute in Newark. The day was arranged and funded by EMR and the Friends of Lowdham and Burton Joyce. The day celebrated 150 years since the historic brake trials. Pupils worked in teams to design and build model locomotives, showcasing creativity and collaboration. A unique highlight was enjoying lunch aboard a stationary plane, adding to the excitement. The experience sparked
