Positivity

The Positivity Ambassadors have had a busy Autumn term. We started by introducing them to their new roles and discussed how we can make our school a positive place.

We used our upcoming assessment week as an example of overcoming possible negative thoughts by using the positive messages and gave some sporting examples.

Respect

The Respect ambassadors have got off to a great start this Autumn term. They worked hard to promote Anti-Bullying week by arranging for everyone to celebrate their individuality by wearing odd socks to school. They also put together and delivered a fantastic assembly teaching the rest of the school the importance of speaking up if they see someone being bullied. Integrity

Integrity Ambassadors have supported the teaching of Online Safety by surveying classes in all year groups. They asked for children's top tips for 'Privacy and Security' online and asked questions about children's 'digital footprints'. The responses are displayed in the hall on our Online Safety display.

At the start of the year, our ambassadors also delivered a whole school assembly. This was to remind children what integrity is all about and the importance of making good choices both in school and outside in our local community.

Determination

Over the course of the autumn term, our Determination Ambassadors have been working tirelessly to ensure their message is heard. On a weekly basis, our ambassadors visit each classroom and share the scores from the past week's Times-Table Rockstars battles, distribute certificates for the week's top scoring participants and ensure posters are clearly positioned for the forthcoming week's battles. Our ambassadors ensure all children understand that their score is not solely a reflection of their times-table recall skills: it equally highlights how determined each child is to make further progress. Behind the scenes, our ambassadors have also been putting the foundations in place for our Key Stage 1 careers event, which will be taking place later in the school year.

Equality

The Equality Ambassadors have been busy researching dyslexia, beginning with a whole-school audit to find out how much pupils already knew about dyslexia and what support is currently in place. Using what they learned, the team created an engaging assembly that helped everyone understand some of the challenges faced by people with dyslexia, while also celebrating the many strengths it can bring. They highlighted well-known individuals with dyslexia and showed how their unique ways of thinking have contributed to their success. The project has helped raise awareness across the school and encouraged everyone to value and support diverse learners.

School Council

The School Council have met together with enthusiasm and determination to make a difference. They worked collaboratively to design posters to promote Children in Need. They arranged a bake sale, organised 'Guess the number of toys in Pudsey's jar' and encouraged children and staff to wear spots or yellow! The event was a huge success and raised a total of £715.70. Well done to all involved. They have already started planning for next term!
